New Results ...





A New Partner Joined



Two new reports were published recently on the I CARE project website.

The Vocational Qualifications Description in Relation to the ECVET Framework, which describes the path followed by the project for the development of the competence matrices. Matrices have been elaborated starting from three elements:

- 1) analysis of existing methodological approaches
- 2) analysis of the Italian background, and
- 3) matrices improvement in cooperation with partners.

The document includes the matrices developed for the five professional profiles comprised in the I CARE project

Assignment of ECVET Points to Relevant Qualifications, which highlights the methodological path followed by the I CARE project to assign points to each unit of learning outcome. ECVET points are a numerical representation of the overall weight of learning outcomes and of the relative weight of units in relation to the qualification. The I CARE project allocates:

- 100 ECVET points to those professions which require a one year long training → Care Operator and Socio-Assistance Assistant, Dental Assistant
- 50 ECVET points to those professions which require a shorter training → Family Assistant, Baby Sitter.

In the I CARE matrices there are also **EVCET sub-points** allocated to each Learning Outcome. Subpoints were allocated to Learning Outcomes according to their relevance in the Unit and according to the total number of LO included in each unit.

Activities in progress ...



The **testing phase** for the Care Operator and Socio-Assistance Assistant profile has been completed in Italy, and is now in progress in all partner countries (Germany, Poland, and Romania). Assessment grids for the remaining three professional profiles on which the I CARE project focuses upon (Family Assistant, Baby Sitter and Dental Assistant) have been developed and will be tested in all the partner countries in the following months.

The I CARE project tests aim to verify the candidate's competences through the simulation and discussion of the main actions to be done during a working day, according to each professional profile. The practical test will last around two hours and it is divided into different concrete situations which correspond to different moments of a typical day of a patient/elderly person/child.

For some job profiles (Socio-Assistance Assistant, Care Operator, Dental Assistant), at the end of the practical test, the candidate will perform a short test on computer literacy, showing that he/she can handle computer programmes which can be useful in his/her profession (Microsoft Word, Excel, Internet Explorer, Outlook Express).
